Building a bond with your child can have longlasting effects. Strengthen your father-child relationship by: **Doing things together**— Children benefit from your attention. Read to your child, play, share meals and celebrate accomplishments; Talking—Start talking to your children when they're young, and not just about serious issues or things they've done wrong; Listening—Listen to your child's ideas, feelings, problems and experiences—and respond without always expressing an opinion; Teaching—Teach the difference between right and wrong as well as life skills. Give praise when your child learns something new; Disciplining with love—Remind your children, calmly and consistently, of the consequences of their actions. Reward them for good behavior; Showing affection—Hug your children and tell them that you will always love them, no matter what. Even after your children leave the nest, stay involved. Ask how they're doing—and then listen attentively. Happy Father's Day!
