Through the leadership of Gethsemane member Tammie Danielsen, a Palestinian Christian of the Lutheran faith tradition, Daoud Nassar will worship with the Gethsemane community Sunday, April 10th. Daoud is director of Tent of Nations (TON) a peace and education center located on the Nassar family 100 acre farm near Bethlehem. The family farm is surrounded on three sides by Israeli settlements and on one side by the Palestinian village of Nahalin. TON has a mission to build bridges of understanding, reconciliation and peace between people and the land. A sign at the entrance to the farm proclaims "We Refuse to be Enemies." Daoud will speak at Westminster Presbyterian Church on Thursday, April 7, 7pm. He will also speak at the University of Texas. Supporting his trip to Austin is The Interfaith Community for Palestinian Rights (ICPR). Gethsemane congregants are invited to visit with him during the 9:30 am Adult Sunday Church School. He will offer the homily during the 8:15 and 10:30 liturgies. Nassar will discuss the mission of TON and the journey of his family since 1916 as they have sought to live peacefully on their family farm in the midst of and increasingly violent situation. The Gethsemane Steffans Hospitality House will provide lodging for Daoud and his daughter on Friday and Saturday nights.
