HOLDEN VILLAGE GIFTS

Gethsemane members have for decades supported the ministry of Holden Village, a Lutheran retreat center in the Cascade Mountain range in the state of Washington. Holden Village was the "No.1 Mining operation in Washington State in 1939." At the peak of mining operations 600 persons lived in the village. In the 1960's, a student at the Lutheran Bible Institute in Seattle asked the owners of the village to "make a gift" of the village to LBI. **Pastor Karl Gronberg** was at the time a student at Pacific Lutheran University. He heard from Randy Stime, another PLU student, whose father was president of LBI of the potential of this gift for the Lutheran community. Since then, through the efforts of countless persons, Holden Village has "gifted" the lives of thousands journeying to the "mountain top". Every year in July, Gethsemane Lutheran remembers "this gift that continues to give" with a Sunday worship where the Holden gift of "Christmas in July" is celebrated. The volunteers work through a variety of children's organizations including public schools, child-care facilities, Head-Start programs, juvenile correctional settings, hospitals, shelters and a large assortment of faithbased groups. Foster Grandparents provide emotional and social support to children of all ages and help to tutor and assist children in essential skills such as reading, writing and math while also offering the basic guidance of a mentor, advocate, and a much needed friend. Presently there are 60 Foster Grandparents serving at over 30 volunteer locations. Gethsemane is thankful for the years of partnership with this organization serving the Central Texas community.
